The CBA basketball program has had a rich tradition of basketball success based, in large part, upon the tenets mentioned above. We are convinced that good things result when hard work and preparation meet opportunity. If you are a player interested in learning the game, a player who isn't afraid to work hard and take instruction, than this is the camp for you.

The CBA basketball camp emphasizes those skills which will help you improve as a basketball player. There is a heavy emphasis upon drills designed to introduce each camper to the techniques which must be mastered in order to compete at the high school level and beyond. Games are usually played on the last day of camp after the entire week's instruction.

The camp staff utilizes the same teaching approach in the camp setting as they do in their daily in-season practice sessions.

Coach Doemel took over the reigns of the Varsity squad in 1998 after successfully serving as coach at the lower levels since 1979. He is a strong believer in the team concept of play.

Doemel's teams have reached the Section II finals in each of the last 6 years and have captured three Section II Class AA titles. He has had the privilege of coaching some great players, most notably, Sean McCloskey, Brian Monahan, Josh Duell, Joe Bova, Lucas Weaver, Greg Holle, & Malcolm Austin. Monahan and Bova were named as the Most Outstanding Player by many area media outlets in their respective senior years.

During his playing days at CBA, Dave was noted for his accurate outside shooting and his intelligent play. Following his graduation from St. Bonaventure in 2001, Dave joined his father on the bench and has been an integral part of restoring CBA to its current prominent position in area basketball circles.

FACILITIES:
