Daniel K. Clemente '96

Dan put up big numbers on the court and in the classroom. Dan was an honor roll student, sporting a 90-plus average, and played varsity basketball for three and a half years. Dan was a two-year captain, and lead by example. According to Hall of Fame coach Jim Pedlow '60, "He was the hardest worker on the team.



No one worked harder to get better." Hustle was a major part of Clemente's game. He would sacrifice his body for the good of his team. His teammates respected him and looked up to him for that.

As a junior, Dan was named to the second team Daily Gazette All Area Team, first team Big 10 All-Star Squad, eighth-team NYS Class A All-Star, and Street & Smith's preseason honorable mention All-American Team. Clemente followed up an impressive junior campaign with a solid senior season. As a senior, Clemente averaged 17.9 points a game, and blended his outside shooting with a strong presence inside averaging 10 rebounds per game. He was named to the Troy Record's All-Area Team, the Times Union All-Area second team, and as a Big 10 first team All-Star.

On January 22, 1996, Clemente scored 21 points to go over the 1,000-point mark for his career, and to lead CBA to a 61-57 victory over LaSalle. Scoring 1,000 points was only one of the many accomplishments of Clemente's that hit the record books. Clemente still holds the records for; most assists [175], most 3 point field goals made [101], and most 3 point field goals attempted [286] in an individual career; most points made [45] in an individual single game.

After graduating from CBA, Clemente attended Harvard University, where he would continue his basketball career. In 1998, Clemente was named Ivy League Rookie of the Year. In 1999, he was named Honorable Mention All-Ivy League. In 2001, Clemente received the Ray Levietes '36 Award as the team MVP, the John P. Fadden Award, the William J. Bingham Award, and was named to the NABC All-District second-team. He also earned the distinction of being named first team All-Ivy League two times in his collegiate career.

In 2000, Clemente was inducted into the Capital District Basketball Hall of Fame. He was recently inducted into the Harvard Athletic Hall of Fame. Dan and his wife of 11 years, Jill, have three children, Daniel (8), Grace (5) and Violet (3).

Dan joins his father Brian '70, and two uncles Tom '69, and Kevin '68 in the CBA Athletic Hall of Fame.

Terrence L. Durham '95



Terrence was a sensational offensive and defensive basketball player for CBA. Standing 6-foot-8, he was given the nickname “Big T”.

As a sophomore, Terrence moved up to the varsity, and was a member of the Big 10 Championship Team. As a junior, Terrence averaged 12 points, 12 rebounds, 3 blocked shots, and 4 assists. He was named second team Big 10 selection. During the summer going into his senior year, Terrence played with the Adirondack team in the Empire State Games.

Terrence was co-captains his senior year with fellow Hall of Fame member, Dan Clemente '96.

Terrence still holds many career records at CBA including; most free throws made [261], most free throws attempted [459], most rebounds [811], most blocked shots [188], and most steals [161] in an individual career; most total rebounds [22] in an individual game; most three throws attempted [238], most rebounds [339], and most blocked shots [86] in an individual single season. Terrence was nominated as a McDonald's All-American High School Top 100 Players in the Nation.

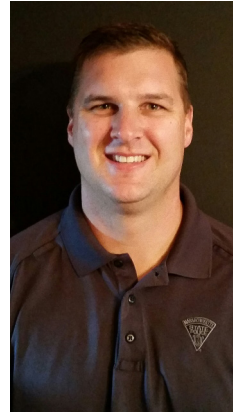
After CBA, Terrence continued his basketball career under scholarship at St. Bonaventure University, which he attended from 1995-1999.

In 2000, Terrence signed his first professional contract with the Plymouth Raisers, then playing in the second-tier National Basketball League. Terrence played 10 years of Professional Basketball in Europe.

Terrence currently lives in Texas, and coaches athletes in grades kindergarten through 6th grade to improve their basketball fundamentals.

James P. Hisgen '96

Jim was a standout student-athlete. He was in the National Honor Society, and ranked Lt. Colonel 1st Battalion. Jim played three years of varsity football, two years of varsity basketball, and three years of varsity track.



As a three-year starter at linebacker, Hisgen was simply sensational on defense for CBA. According to coach Jim Smith '66, he was intelligent, athletic and he loved to hit. Jim played with 100 percent intensity. He loved playing the game and brought enthusiasm onto the field every time. He elevated the level of play and made everyone on his team play as hard as he did.

In 1995, Jim was named Section 2 Defensive Player of the Year, Troy Record's All-Area Defensive Player of the Year, named to the Times Union All-Area Football Team for Defense, and received the Brother Aloysius Memorial Trophy MVP.

Jim was the player to watch. He made an impressive 126 tackles, including three quarterback sacks his senior year, and finished with a stellar 297 tackles in his three-year varsity career with the Brothers.

After graduating from CBA, Hisgen continued his football career at the University of Pennsylvania. In 1998, Jim was named Honorable Mention All-Ivy. In 1999, Jim received the George A. Mungar Award, which was awarded to the team MVP, the Bert Bell Memorial Award, was named All Ivy League, and was a unanimous selection to first team All-Ivy League.

In 2012, Jim was inducted into the Capital Region Football Hall of Fame.

For the past 12 years, Jim has been employed by the FBI. Jim and his wife of 12 years, Emilie, have three children, Noelle (9), Jacob (6) and Gavin (4).

Donald S. La Vigne '84



Don La Vigne excelled in track and field during his time at CBA. He ran track all four years where he specialized in the 400 meter dash. He won the 400m title at the Schenectady Invitational and Big Ten Championship his senior year. Don was also a member of the 4x400 meter relay (including Chris Darrigo '86, Joe Robilotto '84 and Vic Peppers '84) that qualified for the NY State championship meet and also won the Penn Relays and Schenectady Invitational that same year. At the Arlington Relays, Don was on both the winning 4x400 relay as well as the winning distance medley relay with James Thorp '86, Kerry Boyle '85 and Joe Robilotto '84.

Don also competed in field events including the triple jump where he holds the CBA school record for combined 2-man and 3-man jumps with Will Conde '82 and Wendell Champion '82. In addition, the summer after his junior year at CBA he competed in the Empire State Games where he won the gold medal in the decathlon.

Don played basketball all four years at CBA as well. He was a member of the 1983 team that won the Big Ten championship and made it to the Eastern Regional Tournament. Don was also on the 1984 team with fellow inductee Tim McGraw '84 that won the Sectional Title.

After graduating CBA, Don attended Harvard College where he was a Varsity Letter Winner in track and field all four years and was co-captain of the team his senior year. He ran the 400m dash and 400m hurdles. He was an was a second-team All-Ivy League member in 1985 and an All-East selection in the 400m hurdles in 1987. He is on the Harvard All-Time Performance List including the school record set in 1985 for the 4x400 meter relay in a time of 3:10.96 and 3rd best in Indoor Pentathlon with a score of 3492 points.

During the 1987-88 season, Don took a year off from college to compete in the 1988 Olympic Games as a member of the US bobsledding team.

Don has lived in London for the past 16 years. Don and his wife, Calgary have three children, Ava, Margot, and Remy.

Timothy E. McGraw '84

Wearing number 24, Tim was an excellent athlete on the varsity basketball team for two years. His 1983 team was ranked number 3 in New York State. Tim was an outstanding shooter, and a threat to all opponents. As captain of the 1984 team, Tim averaged 15 points a game and shot 92% from the foul line.



Tim was switched to the point guard position during his senior season to fill the void of Todd Holloway's graduation. The 1984 team won the Big 10 Title with a league record of 17-2 and a season record of 20-3. Tim scored 20 points against CCHS, including 11 points in the 4th quarter for a 63-59 win. Tim was named to the first team All-Area by the Schenectady Gazette and the Times Union.

After graduating from CBA, Tim played basketball at Hartwick from 1984-1988. He was the program's all-time leading scorer for an astounding 26 years with 1,878 points. In 1985, Tim was named to the NYS Division III Coaches' All-Freshman basketball team. Tim led the Warriors (19-7) in scoring with 380 points and a 14.6 per game average while shooting 59 percent from the field, and 86 percent from the foul line.

Tim was an All-Region Selection all four years. He shot 89% from the free-throw line in his four seasons, and set a school record for hitting 34 consecutive free throws his sophomore year. Tim ranked 7th in three-pointers made [122], 8th in points in a season [540], and 10th in career assists [347]. Tim was the 3rd best free throw shooter in NCAA Division III basketball with a career percentage of 88.9. In 1987, as captain, Tim lead his team to the Final Four. In four years at Hartwick, McGraw's teams combined for a 76-31 record.

From 1990-98, Tim was the Assistant Basketball coach at Hartwick, and the Head Basketball coach from 1998-2003. He led his team to ECAC in 1999.

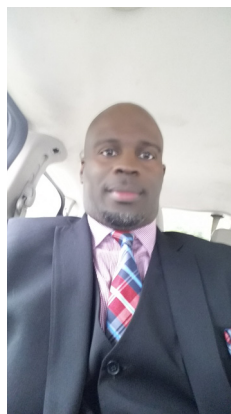
In 1995, Tim was inducted into the Hartwick Athletics Hall of Fame. In 2014, he was inducted into the Capital District Hall of Fame. Tim has worked for Gordon B. Roberts Agency for the last 13 years. Tim and his wife of 23 years, Kelly, live in Oneonta, NY and have three children, Caroline (17), Teddy (14), and Angeline (12).

Tim joins his brother Kevin '78, and his father Ned '50 in the CBA Athletic Hall of Fame.

Tyrone Seabrooks '89

Tyrone was an outstanding athlete who excelled in football and basketball at CBA. Standing 6-foot-4, Tyrone played on the varsity football team for two years, and on the varsity basketball team for two and a half years.

In 1987, Tyrone received the Brother Aloysius Memorial MVP Trophy. In 1989, Tyrone was named All-Big Ten First Team for both football and basketball. The Times Union and Schenectady Gazette named Tyrone to the 1st Team All-Area Football Team. Tyrone set many records at CBA; catches [79], yards [1,450], and touchdown catches [18].



After CBA, Tyrone continued his football career at Bridgton Academy Prep. He was selected as a First Team All-Prep All American.

Tyrone received an athletic scholarship to continue his football career at the University of New Haven (UNH) in Connecticut, where he wore the label “big play” receiver. His most memorable game came against University of Indiana, Pa. grabbing a career-high six aerials for 70 yards, including the winning touchdown with eight seconds left in the game. In 1996, Tyrone earned All-ECAC Player of the Year. Tyrone graduated from New Haven with a BA in Communication and minor in Business Management.

Tyrone hit the UNH Leader Lists for most receptions [76], and most receiving touchdowns [16] in a season.

In 1998, Tyrone was invited to the Buffalo Bills training camp.

Tyrone has worked as a Supervisor for Southwest Airlines for the last 6 years, where he has been featured in many commercials. Tyrone and his wife of 12 years, Yolanda, have three children, Sole (16), Sydney (7), and Ethan (11 months).
