Our graduates have earned over \$16 million in scholarships to study at some of the nations finest institutions including Cornell, Villanova, Boston College, Trinity, RPI, Syracuse, Northeastern, Colgate, Fordham, Holy Cross, Oberlin, and the Berklee College of Music. Our Cadet Colonel will attend Harvard and our Valedictorian will attend the University of Notre Dame.

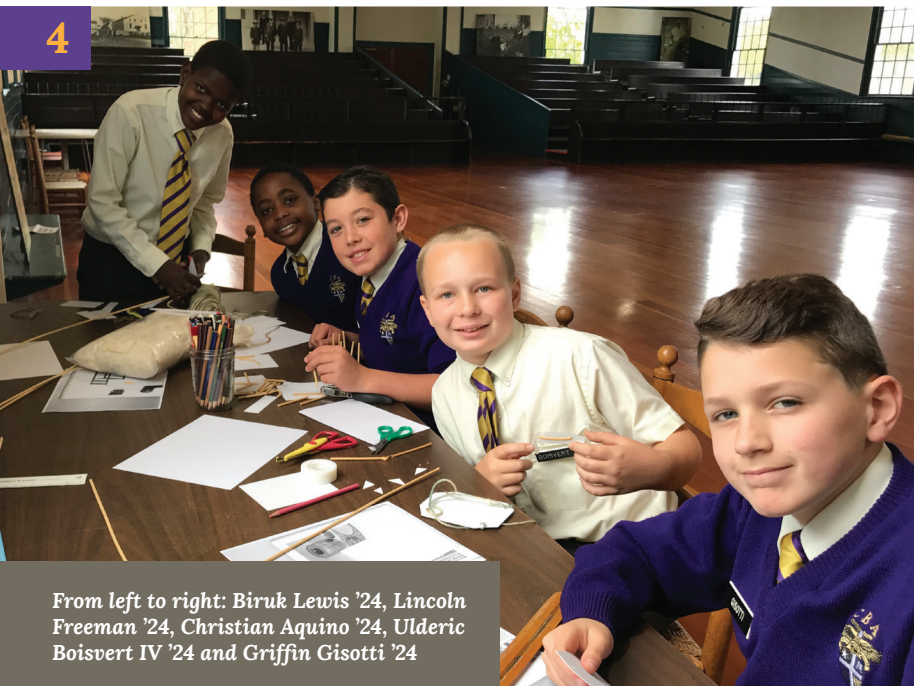

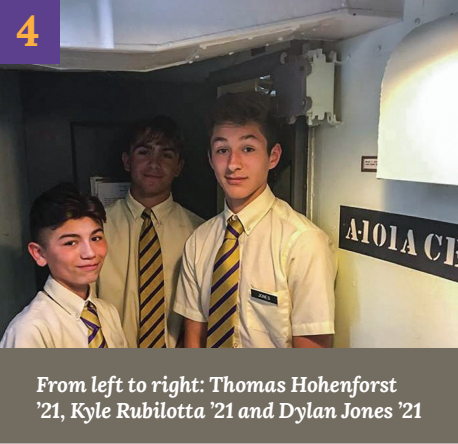

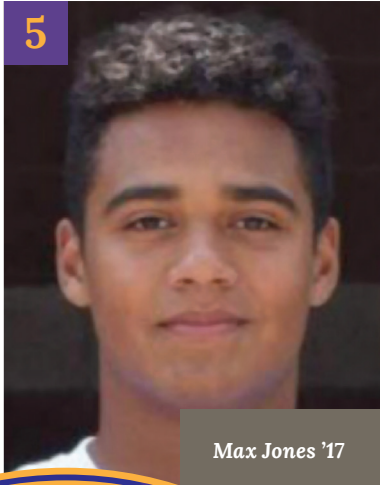

a remarkable \$4.3 million toward the goal. I am confident when the campaign closes in June 2018, we will have exceeded our goal. Your continued support of CBA is gratefully appreciated, invested wisely and amounts to outstanding results.

Every year since 2007, CBA has strategically grown its enrollment while maintaining small class size and providing our students with personal attention. There is no other private school in this area that can claim this same success. Financially, we remain strong, having exceeded our budget for the ninth year in a row. Our surpluses have been reinvested back into our students by improving our educational environment and retaining highly qualified teachers. Enrollment growth and financial stability did not happen by accident. They are the result of the unselfish commitment from so many of our community members.

We are blessed to have increased the number of Brothers interacting with our students on campus.

This year, the LaSalle and CBA Brothers Communities were consolidated at CBA. We now have four Brothers living in the house located on our Airline Drive campus.

Our Defining Moment is so much more than a slogan for our capital campaign. It is an embodiment of the passion and commitment to the mission of the Christian Brothers, to ensure that CBA remains a thriving Catholic scholastic institution for as long as we can possibly imagine.

We will always celebrate our rich heritage and forever remain committed to the future of CBA. We hope to see you on campus soon.
