Last September, we opened our 2021-22 school year with 554 students, which represented our largest opening enrollment since 1950. This year, we surpassed that total and our enrollment today is greater than 570. We are pleased by this continued growth, but not entirely surprised. On a regular basis, our current families inform us of their love for CBA and I'm sure they are sharing that with the greater community. Our dedicated faculty work tirelessly to lead our students toward academic achievement in a caring, faith-filled environment. There was much happening during the first semester. The full brigade participated in the Albany Veterans Day Parade to show gratitude and honor to all veterans of the United States Armed Forces. For the second consecutive season, our varsity football team won the Class AA Super Bowl, advancing to the state semifinals undefeated before suffering their sole loss. CBA's many talented musicians in our performing groups, as well as featured alumni musicians, helped ring in the Christmas season as our gym was transformed into a winter wonderland.

For our senior class, this is an especially exciting time. Several students have received nominations to service academies and as acceptances arrive for the early decision period, our senior class has earned admission to some of the finest colleges and universities in the country. Last month, ten of our student-athletes were recognized for their commitment to continue their athletic careers in college. Soon, the Class of 2023 will begin the series of culminating events that lead to graduation, and finalize their college plans as they proudly transition from CBA students to alumni.

In phase one of our Facility and Field Campaign, the new stadium synthetic turf field brought excitement to our community. This winter, we will begin construction on phase two of our plan - a multipurpose dome. This will provide our students with a premiere facility for year-round JROTC, marching band, and athletic activities. 






### TRUE CRIME GUEST SPEAKER

### PHYSICS CLASS CATAPULTS










### **FOOTBALL**

The Brothers started their 2022 season with the drive and mindset 91.84 ACADEMIC TEAM AVERAGE

to be even better than the year before. Starting off with the annual 'Battle for the Sabre' game on September 2 against rival La Salle; CBA kept the Sabre for the 13th year in a row. 




### VOLLEYBALL




